Prior to this, Glenn was an Assistant Appellate Defender for the Office of the State Appellate Defender, where he drafted appellate briefs for criminal appeals and argued cases before the Illinois appellate and supreme courts. Before becoming a lawyer, Glenn worked as a credit analyst for Wells Fargo Bank and ABN Amro Bank in Houston and then Crédit Agricole Indosuez in Chicago, where he was tasked with the financial analysis of various large corporate clients. Glenn received a Bachelor of Arts in Economics, Political Science, and International Relations from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1989, a Diplôme from the École Supérieure de Commerce à Dijon (now known as the Burgundy School of Business) in 1994, a Masters of Science in Finance from Texas A&M University in 1995, and a Juris Doctor from Loyola University Chicago in 2006. Glenn also obtained his Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) designation in 1998 and volunteers his time grading Level III exams for the CFA Institute.

Glenn comes from a family with a great appreciation for fine arts: his father sculpted, and his mother and brother painted. Glenn began his fine arts journey at the age of six, playing the family keyboard from a kitchen chair (his feet could not quite reach the pedals from the bench).
